Introduction

GGN - Governing Structure

General Assembly

The General Assembly is the legislative body of the GGN.

The General Assembly consists of all individual, supporting, and honorary members and the designated representatives of institutional members.

Executive Board

The Executive Board is the decision making body of the GGN. It consists of not less than nine (9) and not more than fifteen (15) elected members, as well as the Chairperson of the Advisory Committee and a UNESCO Secretariat representative as ex-officio members.

The members of the Executive Board are elected by the Ordinary General Assembly and serve a four (4)-year term of office.

Advisory Committee

The Advisory Committee is the advisory body of the GGN. It consists of the Chairpersons (or their appointed representatives) of the National Geopark Fora / Committees, and the designated representatives of the Affiliated Organisations.

Working Groups - Task Forces International Committees

The Executive Board appoints standing committees, task forces, and working groups, and define their duties

Asian-Pacific Geoparks Network

European Geoparks Network

Latin America and Caribbean Geoparks Network

he Global Geoparks Network (GGN) in September 2014 became a non-profit, non-governmental organization subject to French legislation (the 1901 law on associations) after a unanimous decision of the General Assembly of the Network held in Saint John, Stonehammer Global Geopark, Canada on September 20, 2014. At the same General Assembly of the Network the Statutes of the Global Geoparks Network (GGN) were agreed and adopted.

Following the provisions of the GGN statutes, during the first Ordinary General Assembly of the Global Geoparks Network (GGN) which took place in English Riviera UNESCO Global Geopark on 28th September 2016, the members of the GGN elected the Executive Board of the GGN for the period 2016-2018.

The role and function of the GGN Executive Board is described in the GGN Statutes.

The GGN ExB members during the first two years of their duties worked for the implementation of the GGN statutes and the effective operation of the Organization as well as for the support of the UNESCO Global Geoparks, the broader visibility of the Geoparks and awareness raising on their mission.

The first elected GGN Executive Board had to face major challenges, such as, the implementation of the GGN operation and procedures, efficient communication and activities, as well as the support of the newly established UNESCO Global Geoparks.

These challenges were tedious and time consuming. The first Ordinary General Assembly of the Global Geoparks Network (GGN) reviewed the GGN Statutes, adopted the GGN Internal Rules and Regulations Document and the GGN Code of Ethics, adopted the GGN Report of Activities 2014-2016 and discussed the Strategic plan,

While the strategic decisions were made by the GGN General Assembly, the implementation of the decisions by the GGN Executive Board with the strong support of the GGN Members was painstaking.

The transition of the Voluntary Network operational model to the new International Association structure was a main target and needed continues effort during the last two years. The Global Geoparks Network (GGN) is now fully operating under its new structure.

The implementation of the new administrative and financial procedures, the implementation of the new operation rules and the creation of the new communication tools have been real administrative adventures.

Partnership between UNESCO and the Global Geoparks Network for the operation of the UNESCO Global Geoparks, was one of the main fields of activities for the Network's operational body which was for the first time involved in the procedures on an International Programme with many unforeseen parameters and the procedure was a sailing in an unmapped ocean. The Network managed to submit the agreed financial contribution to the UNESCO Global geoparks special Account without delays and within each financial year. The total amount for 2016 was 120.000 USD, for 2017 was 127.000 USD and for 2018 will be 140.000 USD. In total for the triennium of the UNESCO Global Geoparks 387.000 USD.

CHAPTER I GGN Administrative Challenges

The administrative challenges were connected with the efforts of the GGN Executive Board for the implementation of the provisions of the GGN Statutes for the operation of the different statutory bodies and the activation of the GGN structure which became fully operational.

Main challenges were:

- The activation of the different operational bodies of the GGN
- The spread of information of all GGN members regarding the news and activities of the GGN
- The establishment of new GGN Working Groups / Task Forces / Committees, which gave the opportunity to many colleagues to actively contribute to the life of the Network
- The definition of the framework for the Cooperating Members and Sponsors
- The close coordination with the Regional Networks APGN and EGN and the establishment of the New Latin American and Caribbean Geopark network,
- The Financial stability of the Organization

I.1. GGN Executive Board

The GGN Executive Board had meetings regularly to deal with various issues of the Organization activities.

From September 2016 till September 2018, 25 GGN ExB Meetings took place.

The majority was realized through videoconference while several meetings hosted parallel to Geopark Meetings and Courses and thus the cost was covered mainly by the host organizations (27th ExB Beijing, 32th ExB Lesvos, 35th ExB APGN Meeting Zijindong, 38th ExB Beijing, 44th ExB Lesvos, 47th Adamello – Brenta).

GGN ExB Operation

The GGN ExB decided to share responsibilities among its members aiming the efficient operation of the GGN (27th GGN ExB).

As funding and marketing are fundamental issues for the GGN future, two specific GGN ExB Task Force are created:



Main issues for the GGN ExB operation were:

- 1. Implementation of the GGN GA decision for the GGN Internal Rules and Regulations with the operation of the different GGN bodies.
- 2. Implementation of the GGN GA decision for the GGN financial stability including the 2017 annual Fee for Institutional and Individual Members and the Conference Fee.
- 3. Establishment of the new GGN Working Groups / Task Forces / Committees.

- 4. Request for Proposals for the GGN Communication and Marketing Strategy on UNESCO Global geoparks.
- 5. GGN promotional and capacity building activities
- 6. GGN communication and promotional tools maintenance

All decisions and actions of the GGN ExB were presented through the new GGN communication tool for the GGN members internal communication, the **GGN NewsFeed**.

Decision making on all issues was achieved by reaching a consensus after careful discussion, evaluation and consideration.

The GGN Secretariat continued its operation and communication with the Global Geoparks on GGN issues. I.2. GGN Membership

The GGN ExB in it's 44th Meeting on June 7th 2018 decited to propose 5 new Honorary Members to the 2nd Ordinary General Assembly of GGN.

GGN Cooperating Members

The GGN ExB defined the framework for the acceptance of Cooperating Members. The GGN Task Force of Funding discussed and proposed the criteria which have been accepted by the GGN ExB and published in GGN Website.

I.3. Ordinary General Assembly

According to the GGN Statutes the General Assembly is the legislative body of the GGN.

The General Assembly consists of all individual, supporting, and honorary members and the designated representatives of institutional members.

The Ordinary General Assembly makes decisions on recommendations from the Executive Board on changes to the conditions on application for membership.

The Ordinary General Assembly at its session once every four years on the same dates and in the same place as the International Conference on Geoparks elects the members of the Executive Board.

The Executive Board establishes the agenda of the General Assembly and convenes the Assembly at least thirty (30) days before the date fixed for the meeting. The meetings of the assemblies will take place at the location indicated in the official invitation.

I.3.1. 2nd Ordinary General Assembly

The GGN Executive Board took special care in

collaboration with the Organizing Committee of the 8th International Conference on UNESCO Global Geoparks at the Adamello-Brenta UNESCO Global Geopark, for the organization of the 2nd Ordinary General Assembly of GGN.

I.3.2. Annual General Assembly for Accounts

The Annual General Assembly can be made by written statements sent by the GGN members in good standing by e-mail to the Executive Board within one month after receiving the Report on the accounts of the previous year. This decision need simple majority of the GGN members in good standing

The GGN Executive Board organized two Annual General Assemblies for the adoption of the GGN annual Accounts and Budget

In 2017 for the agreement of the 2016 Accounts and the 2017 Budget.

In 2018 for the agreement of the 2017 Accounts and the 2018 Budget.

In both cases the Annual General Assembly approved the accounts and the budget.

I.4. Regional Networks

Recognizing the very strong role networking has played in the success of the Global Geoparks movement and recognizing the valuable role it plays in facilitating the sharing of experience, formation of joint initiatives and projects and in capacity-building, the GGN encourages the strengthening of Regional Geopark Networks. The Regional Geopark Networks include GGN members at a regional or continental level.

The GGN ExB adopted the decisions of EGN and APGN regarding their functioning as the Regional Networks of GGN in Europe and Asia-Pacific respectfully and supported the creation of the Latin American and Caribeean Geoparks Network.

More specifically the GGN ExB endorsed the following documents:

Endorsement of the EGN CC decision in Burren and Cliffs of Moher UGGp (March 2017) regarding the EGN Rules of Operation .

Endorsement of the APGN CC decisions in Zijindong Cave UGGp (September 2017) regarding the APGN Rules of Operation

Endorsement of the Latin American and Caribeean Geoparks Network establishment declaration and the Latin American and Caribeean Geoparks Network Operational Rules as decided in Comarca Minera UGGp in January 2018

Endorsement of the EGN Annual Report of Activities 2016 and 2017 as submitted by the EGN CC decision in Burren and Cliffs of Moher UGGp (March 2017) and in Karavenke-Karawanken UGGp (March 2018).

Endorsement of the EGN Annual Report of Activities 2016 as submitted by the APGN Coordinator.


The GGN ExB discussed in detail the activities and development of the Regional Networks and was present in all Regional Meetings and Conferences organized during the last two years.

I.4.3. The Latin American and Caribbean Geoparks Network Foundation

The declaration for the creation of Latin American and Caribbean Geoparks Network was signed on May 26th 2017, during the IV Workshop of Geoparks which took place in Arequipa, Peru in May 2017.

The declaration was signed by the representatives of the founding members which are the existing four UNESCO Global Geoparks in Latin American and Caribbean: Araripe in Brazil, Grutas Del Palacio in Uruguay, Mixteca Alta and Comarca Minera in Mexico.

It was also undersigned by UNESCO (Patrick Mac Keever) and the Global Geoparks Network (Guy Martini) and the representatives of 11 aspiring Geoparks in Peru, Argentina, Bolivia, Chile, Colombia, Cuba, Ecuador and Nicaragua as well as the representatives of UNESCO and the Global Geoparks Network. Testimonies of the declaration were the representatives of the institutions and participants at the IV Workshop of Geoparks which took place in Peru in May 2017. The Latin American and Caribbean Geoparks Network will be based in Araripe UGG Brazil during 2018.

GEO-LAC Operational Guidelines and Elections

This was the first Coordination Committee Meeting of the Latin America and Caribbean Geoparks Network, the representatives of the four UNESCO Global Geoparks in the region: Araripe – Brazil, Grutas del Palacio – Uruguay, Comarca Minera Hidalgo and Mixteca Alta from Mexico, met to discuss and decide on the Operation Guidelines of the Network and elect the Coordinators and other officials.

I.5. GGN National Fora/ Committees

According to the GGN Statutes a National Geopark Forum or Committee, including all the members of the GGN in each country, may be authorised by the Executive Board to represent the interests of Global Geoparks and the Global Geopark and to organise activities of the GGN in that State.

The GGN Executive Board followed the approach of the founding ExB that the creation of different bodies with responsibilities on Geoparks in the same country should be avoided. If possible, the existing National Geoparks Committees or National Geoparks Fora, should become the responsible body for Geoparks at the National level.

This model was adopted and is well functioning in the following countries: UK, Italy, Ireland, Portugal, France, etc.

There are countries in which a different model of operation has been selected for several reasons.

There are countries in which both National Geoparks Committees and National Geoparks Fora exist. In China and Japan there are well operated National Geopark Networks.

The GGN ExB taking into account the current situation of the Network, the need of the coordination of activities of the GGN at the national level and the increasing number of UNESCO Global Geoparks encourages the operation of a GGN National Body including all the members of the GGN in each country (which can use the name National Geopark Network).

I.6. GGN Reporting

Geoparks Annual Reports (Institutional Members)

All GGN Institutional Members should submit it to GGN an Annual Report on their activities(GGN Statutes article 21 session 5). The GGN ExB adopted the GGN - Geopark Annual Report Model [doc] which the Institutional Members should fill in the form and send it back to GGN Association (ggnannualreport@hotmail.com).

Responsible for the compilation of the Reports is Dr. Mahito Watanabe.

GGN Institutional Members Reports for 2016 was uploaded in GGN website.

The same as a routine work of all GGN Institutional Members happened for 2017 and are uploaded in GGN website.

GGN Regional Network 2017 Annual Report of Activities

I.7. GGN Working Groups and Task Forces

I.7.A. GGN Task Forces

The GGN ExB disided the establishment of several GGN task Forces.

GGN Task Force on Marketing and Communication

The GGN Task Force chaired by **Gail Bremner** (Canada) includes **M-L. Frey** (Germany), **P. Melo** (Brazil) and **M. Oabbas** (Morocco).

Following the decisions of the last GGN General Assembly in September 2016 in English Riviera UGG, the GGN Executive Board decided the formation of this Task Force to elaborate a strategy on GGN Promotion.

The GGN Task Group elaborated a proposal for an open call in order to select a professional company who will work and develop a Geopark promotion strategy.

The GGN Executive Board in its 32nd Meeting which took place on Lesvos island Greece on June 12th 2017 completed the elaboration of the Task Force proposal. The OPEN CALL text was adopted as the proposal of the GGN ExB to the members of the GGN.

All GGN Members were invited to express their opinion on the Open Call for the Geoparks Promotion Strategy and send to the GGN their comments and proposals till the 31st July 2017.

The Request For Proposals (RFP) on GGN Marketing and Communication Strategy released in February with a cost of 50.000 Euros for this reason.

Open call - RFP: GGN Marketing and Communication Strategy

The GGN through the Request for Proposals is seeking Expressions of Interest for the development and implementation of a Communication and Marketing Strategy to elevate global awareness of UNESCO Global Geoparks, focusing on the value and mandates they bring or can bring to their respective territories. The successful proponent will work with the GGN as appropriate throughout all stages of the contract.

Seven applicants replied to the GGN Request for Proposals and after evaluation of the proposals by the GGN Executive Board, the Applicant "David Randal and Associates" got the highest score and won the contract.

David Randal worked with the GGN in the past as he was selected by the Organizing Committee as the Executive Director of the 7th International Conference on UNESCO Global Geoparks 2016.

The contract among GGN and David Randal was signed on July 17^{th} 2018.

GGN Task Force on Funding

The GGN Task Force on Funding chaired by K. Rangnes

includes also G. Bremner (Canada), M. Watanabe (Japan), J. Zhang (China).

Following the decisions of the last GGN General Assembly in September 2016 in English Riviera UGG, the GGN Executive Board decided the formation of this Task Force to explore new sources for the funding of the GGN activities.

The GGN Task Force also elaborated the rules for the Cooperating members of GGN as well as for the framework for sponsorships to the GGN activities.

I.7.B. GGN Working Groups

Working Groups may be authorised by the Executive Board to implement programmes and activities, and to serve as a channel of communication between members of the GGN with similar scientific and professional interests.

The GGN ExB defined the operational framework of the Working Groups and decided to establish thematic GGN Working Groups. Working Groups will be formed after a decision of the GGN ExB and will have geographical representation.

The GGN ExB discussed the establishment the following GGN Working Groups.

- GGN Working Group on Geo-Hazards
- GGN Working Group on Volcanic Areas
- GGN Working Group on Geological Heritage Assessment
- GGN Working group on Tourism
- GGN Working group on Education
- GGN Working group on Sustainable Development Goals
- GGN Working group on Island Geoparks.

1. WG on Geoparks in Volcanic Areas







II.1 Contribution and Participation in UNESCO Global Geoparks operation


The GGN facilitated the duties of the GGN according to the IGGP statutes, with a series of actions aiming the improvement of the effectiveness of the UNESCO Global Geopark functioning as described below:

- The GGN ExB on April 17th 2018, endorsed the candidatures from UNESCO Global Geopark Representatives submitted for the renew of 6 members of the UNESCO Global Geopark Council.. (42nd ExB).
- The GGN President, Nikolas Zouros, participated in the 1st and 2nd Annual meetings of the UNESCO Global Geopark Council (2016, 2017) for the revaluation and revalidation report assessment, as well as to various decisions of the Council made through electronic communication. UNESCO Global Geopark Council adopted the new UNESCO Global Geopark documents regarding the International value of the geological heritage assessment, the evaluation and revalidation geopark report templates and evaluators report templates.


- The GGN President, Nikolas Zouros, participated in the UNESCO Global Geopark Bureau who is responsible for the nomination of the Evaluators for the Geopark Evaluation and Revalidation missions. UNESCO Global Geopark Bureau decisions regarding the function of the UNESCO Global Geoparks made through electronic communication.
- The GGN in collaboration with the UNESCO Global Geopark Secretariat facilitated the organization of the Geopark Evaluation and Revalidation missions.
- The GGN provided to UNESCO Global Geopark special Account the financial support during 2016, 2017 and 2018 for Geopark activities.
- The GGN in collaboration with the UNESCO Global Geopark Secretariat lunched in January 2018 the call for hosts of the 9th International Geoparks Conference.

II.2. Contribution to the management of the Roster of Evaluators

The Roster of evaluators is one of the duties of the Global Geopark Network according to the UNESCO Global Geoparks Operational Guidelines.









The GGN in collaboration with the UNESCO Global Geopark Secretariat lunched in 2017 and 2018 calls for the enrichment of the Roster of Geopark evaluators.

The received applications were assessed with the criteria and the Roster served for the Geopark Evaluation and Revalidation missions.

CRITERIA FOR INSCRIPTION

Each evaluator should fulfil at least two of the criteria below:

- · Be a manager or have a coordinating role in a "green card" holding UNESCO Global Geopark for at least 4 years;
- · Combined and proven professional experience relevant to UNESCO Global Geopark development (in at least three of the following areas: geological heritage, geological conservation, sustainable development, tourism development and promotion, environmental issues, community engagement, and public communication of geoscience) for at least 5 years;
- · Be a current member of the former Global Geoparks Bureau, Asia Pacific Geoparks Network (APGN) – Advisory Committee, and/or European Geoparks Network (EGN) – Advisory Committee.

II.3. New UNESCO Global Geoparks

NEW UNESCO Global Geoparks 2017

The UNESCO Executive Board during it's 121 session on May 5th 2017 unanimously endorsed the decisions made by the UNESCO Global Geoparks Council during its first session in Torquay, UK, in September 2016 and eight territories demonstrating the great diversity of our planet's geology have received the UNESCO Global Geopark label.

During the last two years a variety of activities was carried out by the Global Geopark Network, its Regional Networks as well as the GGN Working Groups.

The main aim of the Geopark activities was to raise the Geopark profile and promote Geoparks as tools for geological heritage protection and promotion and sustainable development of the local communities.

The Global Geopark Network organized International Conferences and Capacity building activities on UNESCO Global Geoparks, create a partnership with the International Tourism Organization for the promotion of Geoparks as sustainable tourism destinations, participated in International Tourism Fairs and Events, establish common celebration of International days, organized International Press Conferences and produced and operated a variety of communication tools.

One important action was also the RFP for a new Geoparks Communication and Marketing Strategy with the support of a professional company.







III.1. Geopark Conferences

1.A. International Geoparks Conference

1.A. a. 8th International Conference on UNESCO Global Geoparks 2018

According to the GGN Statutes "The GGN shall hold an International Geoparks Conference every two years".

The GGN Executive Board discussed issues related with the effective organization of the 8th International Conference which will be organized in Adamello Brenta UGG in several meetings. The GGN ExB nominated two of its members M. Burlando and M. Border to assist with advice the Organizing Committee

It was also decided to have the organisation of various GGN meetings (GGN General Assembly, GGN Advisory Committee Meeting, GGN ExB Meetings, EGN AC and CC meetings, APGN AC and CC meetings, UGG/GGN Evaluators Seminar).

1.A. b. 9th International Conference on UNESCO Global Geoparks 2020

The GGN ExB in collaboration with the UGG Secretariat circulated the Call for Host of the 9th International Conference on Geoparks 2020.

Proposals were submitted on time by the Jeju and the Danxiashan UNESCO Global Geoparks.

The Host will be announced during the Closing Ceremony of the 8th International Conference on Geoparks.

1.B. Regional Geoparks Conferences

During September 2017 two important Geopark

Conferences were successfully organized by the European Geoparks Network and the Asian Pacific Geoparks Network.

1.B.a. 14th European Geoparks Conference

More than 350 participants from 30 countries took part in the European Geopark Coonference in Azores UGG.

The 14th European Geopark Conferences prove to be excellent opportunity for all Geopark representatives to meet and exchange ideas and information.

Several colleagues from other Regional networks joint the event.

Parallel to the Conference the 39th EGN Coorfination Committee Meeting took place.

1.B.b. 5th Asian Pacific Geoparks Network Symposium

More than 800 participants from 27 countries took part in the impressive 5th Asian Pacific Geoparks Symposium in Zhijindong Cave UGG.

During the Symposium presented examples of best practice in Geoparks operation and management, in networking and collaboration among Geoparks and in building stronger and more effective partnerships and collaborations.





Parallel to the 5th APGN Symposium the APGN Advisory Committee and Coordination Committee meetings took place and the new APGN Coordinator s and AC members were elected.

The 1st Latin America and Caribbean Geoparks Meeting

The 1st Latin America and Caribbean Geoparks Meeting took place in Comarca Minera Hidalgo in Mexico 21-25 January 2018.

Parallel to the Coordination Committee Meeting, open sessions were organized with the participation of the representatives of the 4 Latin American and

Caribbean UNESCO Global Geoparks, UNESCO, GGN, the two Canadian UNESCO Global Geoparks and aspiring Geoparks from Peru, Bolivia, Ecuador, Colombia.

The first open session was dedicated to the official celebration of the recognition of Comarca Minera Hidalgo as UNESCO Global Geopark with the participation of the Governor of Hidalgo State, the Secretary of Tourism of Hidalgo state and all the Mayors of the Geopark.

Other open sessions included presentations of best practice from the participating Geoparks and field trips to the impressive geosites of the Comarca Minera Hidalgo UNESCO Global Geopark.



III.2. Capacity Building Activities

GGN operates or supports training courses and other capacity building activities relevant to the UNESCO Global Geoparks establishment, operation, management and activities.

The GGN Executive Board gave special emphasis to the organization of Courses and Workshops during the last two years in collaboration with UNESCO.

In order to support effectiveness, visibility and participation of the different Geopark capacity building activities, which are under preparation in several countries, the GGN ExB find out that it is necessary better preparation and coordination. Thus the GGN ExB asked the potential organizers to submit their proposals to GGN and UNESCO Global Geopark Secretariat at least 6 months in advance providing the necessary information in order to allow better coordination and representation of GGN and UNESCO Global Geopark Secretariat.

The GGN supported the organization of the following activities:

10th International Intensive Course on Geoparks in Lesvos (June 2016) (13th ExB).

2.A. 9th International Intensive Course on Geoparks in Lesvos (June 2017)

The Intensive Course on Geoparks was organized with great success by GGN and UNESCO in collaboration with the University of the Aegean and the Natural History Museum of the Lesvos Petrified Forest in the Lesvos



island UNESCO Global Geopark.

50 Participants from many countries including representatives from new UNESCO Global Geoparks and aspiring Geoparks: Vietnam, Brazil, Japan, China, Kazakhstan, Italy, Kenya, Cyprus, Mexico, Bangladesh, Kenya, Tanzania, Hungary, Portugal, Saudi Arabia, Bolivia, Ireland, UK and Greece.

UNESCO, GGN Executive Board, the World Tourism Organization, the Chinese Geoparks Network were among the invited lecturers.

Additionally were invited tourism specialists from the University of the Aegean, the Ephorate of Antiquities of Lesvos and tourism providers of activity tourism in Lesvos Geopark.

2.B. 3rd International Intensive Course on UNESCO Global Geoparks in Beijing (November 2017)

Following the success of the 1st and 2nd International Training Courses on Global Geoparks, Beijing, China in 2016, and with the strong supports from the Global Geoparks Network (GGN), UNESCO Jakarta Office, Department of Geo-environment at the Ministry of Land and Resources, China, Chinese Geoparks Network, and University of the Aegean, Greece, the 3rd International Training Course on Global Geoparks themed the 'Geoparks Management and Earth Heritage Interpretation' was successfully held in Beijing, China from December 3 to 8, 2017.

This Course was jointly organized by the China University of Geosciences, Beijing and Fangshan UNESCO Global Geopark, China.

A total of 100 participants from 25 UNESCO Global Geoparks of China (including many high-rank geopark managers), several aspiring UNESCO Global Geoparks from China, and more than 10 geopark technical supporting organizations and universities took part in the training course.

The invited lectures included 7 GGN ExB members and/



or UGGp Council members, they are: N. Zouros (Greece), Jin Xiaochi (China), I. Komoo (Malaysia), M. Watanabe (Japan), M. Frey (Germany), K. Rangnes (Norway) and Zhang Jianping (China), as well as the geoparks experts I. Valiakos (Greece), KM Yeung (Hong Kong, China), Zheng Yuan (China), Tian Mingzhong (China) and Wu Fadong (China).

The Training Course started with an opening ceremony on December 4, 2017. Mr. Liu Yuan, inspector at the department of Geo-Resources expressed strong support on the geopark capacity building activity in Beijing.

The training course comprises two parts: the first part was dedicated to the UNESCO Geoparks Management, and the second part was dedicated to the Geopark Museum, Visitor Centers, and Earth Heritage Interpretation.

The invited lecturers focused their presentations on the geopark concept and management, IGGP Statutes and UGG Operational Guidelines, GGN Statutes and Code of ethics, as well as UGG evaluation and revalidation processes.

Meanwhile, the UNESCO Global Geoparks and Geoconservation in Asia and Pacific; Global Geoparks Network and Regional Geoparks Networks: Networking and Common Activities; UNESCO Global Geoparks in China: Quo Status and Challenges; UNESCO Global Geoparks Collaboration Agreements: Framework – Common activities and Results. Global Geoparks Network Working Groups – structure and operation; the GGN WG on Tourism and the Geoparks activities on Tourism; Geosciences Research in Geoparks; Geoparks Contribution to UNESCO Sustainable Development Goals, and Management System of Geoparks in Japan and Community Involvement were also presented.

The second part of the Course from December 6-8, 2017, was held in the Fangshan UNESCO Global Geopark. The contents concentrated on the Geopark Museum:

management and operation; the role of visitor centers in UNESCO Global Geoparks and World Heritage sites; how to Design and Develop a signage system for geopark: Examples from Hong Kong UGGp; Geological Heritage Interpretation Facilities and Tools.

Examples from UNESCO Global Geoparks; Geoheritage interpretation.

The training course included oneday field trip. On December 7, all participants of the course took a field trip in Fangshan UNESCO Global Geopark, including visiting its geopark museum, Peking Man Museum, as well as some visitor centers and interpretation panels in the geopark territory.

2.C. 10th International Intensive Course on Geoparks in Lesvos (June 2018)

The 10th International Intensive Course on Geoparks was organized with success by GGN and UNESCO in collaboration with the University of the Aegean and the Natural History Museum of the Lesvos Petrified Forest in the Lesvos island UNESCO Global Geopark.

50 Participants from many countries including representatives from new UNESCO Global Geoparks and aspiring Geoparks: Vietnam, Japan, China, Italy, Indonesia, Iran, Cyprus, New Zeeland, Norway, Spain, Tanzania, The Netherlands, Turkey, Saudi Arabia, France, UK and Greece.

UNESCO, GGN Executive Board, the Chinese Geoparks Network were among the invited lecturers. Additionally were invited tourism specialists from the University of the Aegean and the Natural History Museum of the Lesvos Petrified Forest conservation team.

The course focused of Geoheritage management and Geoconservation techniques and practice together with activities related with Geopark management and operation.





III.3. a. GGN Best Practice Awards

The Global Geoparks Network (GGN) Best Practices Award aims to promote, enhance and encourage the development of innovative initiatives inside the Global Geoparks of UNESCO.

The award will recognise pioneering practices and initiatives that contribute to a more effective and dynamic network, set fantastic exemples for others to follow and emulate, and create greater public recognition of the UNESCO Global Geoparks.

The prize honours the management and / or a partner of a UNESCO Global Geopark for the pioneering nature and quality of the initiative, encouraging all the GGN members to work in the same line.

The 2018 GGN Best Practices Awards include three awards, granted by the GGN Association in partnership with the Organizing Committee of the 8th International Conference on UNESCO Global Geoparks in the Adamello Brenta UNESCO Global Geopark, Italy.

The GGN Awards 2018-2019 include six awards, granted by the Global Geoparks Network (GGN)

There will be 5 categories for the GGN Awards:

- Geological heritage conservation in Geoparks
- Education
- Tourism and Sustainable Development
- Networking
- Local participation
- One Special Award for Aspiring Geoparks based on their participation in GGN activities which showed its commitment to GGN.

The Global Geoparks Network (GGN) Awards will be awarded during the International Conference on UNESCO Global Geoparks based on proposals submitted by either the Geopark Managers or the Geopark Evaluators.

III.6. Celebrating United Nations International Days to raise profile of the UNESCO Global Geoparks

UNESCO Global Geoparks need visibility through communication activities to rise their profile as territories of excellence hosting geological heritage sites of international importance, as sustainable tourism destinations, as learning territories promoting sustainability in social and economic development, as hidden treasures to visit, explore, discover and live!

The Global Geoparks Network Executive Board at its meeting on December 3rd, 2017 in Beijing discussed importance of using the opportunity of the UN International Days to promote UNESCO Global Geoparks and to underline their contribution to raise awareness for the environmental protection and care of our planet. More specifically on some critical issues of global importance such us geo-hazard risk reduction and climate change awareness.

In 2017 several UNESCO Global Geoparks organized events in the frame of a common campaign for the International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction. The

variety of events coordinated by the GGN Geo-hazard Working Group included public talks, activities with schools or other groups, implementation of educational programs, small exhibitions and other action.

On December 11 2017, UNESCO Global Geoparks celebrated the International Mountain Day by a campaign through social media to promote their role in raising social interest on mountains and in revitalizing mountainous communities through geotourism activities. The majority of the UNESCO Global Geoparks lie on mountainous territories. Yet mountains are under threat from climate change, land degradation, over exploitation and natural disasters, with potentially far-reaching and devastating consequences, both for mountain communities and the rest of the world.

The Global Geoparks Network Executive Board encourages UNESCO Global Geoparks to celebrate jointly under common campaigns UN International Days in 2018 aiming to gain further support to their activities and promote the values of Earth heritage protection and sustainable local development.

The GGN will organize the common campaign for the promotion of the activities using the GGN promotional tools through internet.

50.000 or 25,54% will be the expenditure for the GGN Marketing and Communication strategy to promote UNESCO Global Geoparks! (Payment will be realized in 2018).

34.754 or 17,75% is payment for the for GGN operation and activities in 2017.

The GGN Executive Board believes that this year was made a significant step forward for the stabilization of the Global Geoparks Network financial status which permits further development of activities in the future without major threats or uncertainties.
